### Host University

Karnatak University is the second oldest university, after the University of Mysore in Karnataka. It was established at Dharwad in 1949 in a sprawling campus spread over 750 acres of land and had covered entire North Karnataka under its jurisdiction. The University has achieved tremendous development under the leadership of Wrangler Dr. D.C. Pavate, and other successive Vice- Chancellors from time to time. The University at present covers four districts of North Karnataka under its jurisdiction. It has seven faculties and three Post- Graduate Centres at Haveri, Gadag and Karwar and few constituent and hundreds of affiliated colleges. The university identifies the regional needs and overall development of students of this region of North Karnataka, and has undertaken several steps to popularize higher education. The University has recently been recognized with the Potential for Excellence by the University Grants Commission.

### Host Department

The Department of Sociology is one of the oldest Post-Graduate Departments established in the year 1957 under the leadership of late Dr.K.Chandrashekaraiyah, a Frankfurt trained Sociologist. The department is celebrating its Diamond Jubilee. The department has attained the reputation of being one of the most popular departments in social sciences, due to its mission of teaching, research and extension activities.

At present the department is actively involved in teaching and research activities in the thrust areas like Industrial Sociology, Sociology of Gender, Sociology of Development, Social change and Transformation, Community studies, Urbanization and Urban development, Gerontology, Sociology of Health, Social Marketing and Environment etc. The funded projects have also been availed by the faculty from the reputed institutions such as the UGC and ICSSR. The Department has made an outstanding achievement in conducting workshops, conferences including the 33rd All India Sociological Conference of the Indian sociological society and two Conferences of the Karnataka sociology association. In addition, the department has also been sanctioned with SAP DRS-I from 2009-2014 and DRS-II from April 2015 to March 2020 by the University Grants Commission, New Delhi, to work on the thrust area "Health and Development" with special reference to North Karnataka. Under this programme, the department has organized National Conferences in the year 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014, and 2016.

### About National Conference

The proposed two days national conference on "Health, Environment and Development" tries to explore the available scientific knowledge by way of creating a frame work to understand the relationship between health environment and development, thereby bringing forth strategies to solve the ongoing correlated challenges.

Health, environment and development are about and for the well being of people. Health is an essential part of the quality of life, which is the overall goal of development. The environment provides the medium for the expression of health and development is the strategy to meet their needs of health and well-being. Hence issues in health, environment and development are the major concern today. However, the spectrum of health, environment and development scenario has changed considerably over the years. There have been major advances in science and technology, health and medicine, infrastructure, literacy, education, income and opportunities, yet, instances in the health gaps are discernible. Irrespective of the economic development, age-old public health hazards due to inadequate and unsafe food and water supply, pollution, degradation, poor sanitation, hygiene, etc. are still prevalent. In addition, the new environment and development problems have threatened the entire ecosystem and presented additional threats to human health. The problems of ill health and premature deaths have been caused by biological agents in the human environment in water, food, air and soil. Many of the health and environmental problems are often related to poverty, gender, demographic changes, ageing, urbanization, and epidemiological changes - including continuing high incidence of infectious diseases, increasing incidence of non-communicable diseases, injuries and violence - pollution, lack of proper shelter, water, sanitation and poor food hygiene.

The fundamental factor that contributes to the problems of health and environment is due to inadequate attention given to health issues in development policies and practices. The root causes of problems are often related to the way in which development at large has proceeded, with little attention paid to the effects on the environment and health. There is a need for new technologies, the private and public sector partnership, meaningful role of civil society to address the driving forces operating in society such as tackling inequalities, poverty, population growth, controlling land degradation and deforestation, biodiversity loss, soil erosion,

ensuring food security, safe drinking water and solid waste management. These issues must become an integral part of planning within the frame work of sustainable development.

It is evident from various international meetings that health issues are an increasingly important item on the broad environment and development agenda. Of late the environmental issues are receiving more prominence on the public health agenda. Hence, development, management of the environment and protection of public health must be addressed together in an integrated way. While the environmental movements have highlighted the aspect of sustainability, the health movement has laid special stress on the issues of social justice, equity and human development. Not only are healthy people needed to ensure development, but also health is not possible without development. Hence there is an increasing need to form a partnership, to work across and within sectors for addressing complex and interrelated problems.

In the backdrop of this the present conference focuses on comprehending the role played by various sectors in influencing health and environment conditions and to view how health and environmental considerations can best be incorporated in developmental process. The conference most importantly makes an effort to consider the settings in which health is created.

In the light of this focus, papers are invited on the following sub-themes to create framework between health, environment, and sustainable development which extends from the epidemiological domain to the policy domain.
