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## Guidelines for UG Admissions:2024-25

Ref: 1)Govt. order ED 166, UNE 2023, Bangaluru dt. 08.05.2024
2) Proceedings of the Deans committee:22-05-2024

1. It is recommended to opt for case No. 1 (model-1) for BA/ B. Sc. having 3 major system for all the three years and Case No-3 (Model -3) for other degree programmes with effect from 2024-25 and onwards.
2. As per provisions in the above GO, it is recommended to fix the upper limit of 138148 credits for degree programmes by adding:
i. One additional credit for all the Major to have 06 credits each, instead of 05 credits and 03 credits for electives courses instead of 02 credits for BA / B.Sc.programmes(Annexure-1 \&2).
ii. One additional credit for first four semesters for Core papers with 4 credits each for 04 papers instead of 03 papers, 3 credits for electives for all other degree programmes (other than BA and BSc programmes); 5 papers with 04 credits each in $5^{\text {th }}$ and $6^{\text {th }}$ semester having a provision of 03 compulsory papers and 02 electives; 03 credits for internship in $5^{\text {th }}$ semester and 03 credits for Research methodology in $6^{\text {th }}$ semester instead of 02 credits each (Annexure-3, 4\&5).
iii. BA / B.Sc. with practical core subjects shall have $4+2$ credits for Theory + Practical (Annexure-1).
iv. BA without practical core subjects shall have $5+1$ credits for Theory + tutorial (Annexure-2).
v. Examination shall be conducted for Papers/ Subjects having credits 2 for 50 marks.
vi. Examination shall be conducted for Papers/ Subjects having credits $\geq 3$ and up to 06 for 100 marks.
vii. There shall be Internal Assessment for every paper/ Course/ Subject for 20\% of maximum marks and semester end examination for $80 \%$ of maximum marks (i.e., 20:80).
viii. One credit shall have 15 hours Syllabus for theory. Ex. 04 credits paper shall have 60 hours syllabus / semester. 02 Credit practical shall have at least 12 experiments with 4 hours each (Total 56 hours / Semester).
ix. One additional hour is provided for Languages (AECC) Ex. 03 credits language shall be taught for 04 hours as in NEP-2020 (Annexure-1,2,3,4,\&5).
x. Since the Govt. order ED 166, UNE 2023, Bangaluru dt. 08.05.2024 is the revision of Govt. order pertaining to NEP-2020 issued during 2021, all the NEP subjects are retained for both B.A. and B.Sc. Degree combinations with the 04 group model(Annexure-6\&7).
xi. Any two languages shall be chosen as per the existing three group language system. Functional Kannada may be chosen for the foreign / South Indian (other than Karnataka) students who know English only and do not know other languages available in the college (Annexure-8).
xii. It is resolved to prepare the draft regulations accordingly for approval by Academic council. Syllabus be prepared immediately.
xiii. B.A. and B.SC., students shall study only one skill each in their Major subjects chosen either in $4^{\text {th }}$ or $5^{\text {th }}$ or $6^{\text {th }}$ semester.
xiv. There shall be, one elective course. The elective will be selected by the student with his / her choice subject to the availability of courses in the University / Colleges. This elective may be discipline-based or distinctly related to discipline-based majors. Thus, the elective course should be supportive of the major Discipline-based Core courses(Annexure- 9 and 10)
